SARI (*s-air-ē*) is short for **Smyrnéa** (*smur- knee- āh*) Archaeological **R**esearch Institute. While our name may be long we have a simple goal; to provide citizens and visitors alike a unique, personal experience with the past through archaeology. **SARI** was founded in 2017, by two archaeologists (and best friends), to bring their love of the past to everyone in New Smyrna. The Smyrnéa colony began in 1768 and for nine years hard working men and women built a new way of life as part of British East Florida. These first colonists built hundreds of structures including a windmill, a church, large agricultural processing areas, and of course, the irrigation canals that are perhaps the most visible remnant of the colony today.

We invite you to join us on our journey of discovery to bring the life of the colony into focus. Our long range research goal is to produce a virtual/digital colony through the recording of archaeological sites that have already been documented and those that are still unknown. Through digital modeling we hope to bring you directly to the past to experience what life was like 250 years ago. 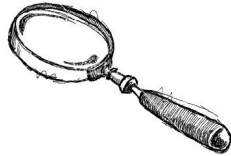
SARI is a membership based, not-for-profit organization. Membership and program fees directly fund our work.

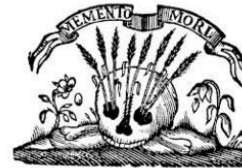

PREHISTORIC TECHNOLOGY I & II

June 19, 2018 AND
June 26, 2018 9am—3pm
Location at SARI <outdoors>
Grade Level 4-6
Cost \$60 each session



Campers will have the unique opportunity to participate in experimental archaeology projects to reproduce similar prehistoric technologies used by Timucua who once resided in the area. Campers will learn about native plants and materials that were a part of the prehistoric tool kit. Campers will make twine, learn to use an ancient spear thrower, craft their own shell tools, experiment with native dyes, wood work among other activities. Hands-on activities will include making an engraved shell gorget to take home.



ARCHAEOLOGY OF DEATH

Learn about global customs surrounding death and burial—past and present, including: types of burials, entombment, mummification, and even some “strange practices” that were common just 100 years ago. Campers will participate in analyzing mortuary behavior in our specially designed *Mystery Cemetery*.



ARCHAEOLOGY FIELD EXPERIENCES

Our field school offers 3-day field experiences for middle school students and 3 or 5-day field school for anyone in High School or older (this means adults too!).

Field Schools consist of one day in the classroom and the remaining time spent working alongside professional archaeologists in the field and/or laboratory processing their finds. Activities may include shovel testing, unit excavation, artifact screening, and basic laboratory work.
